


EU Pledges Support for Cycling with Landmark Declaration

EU Transport Commissioner Adina Vălean made a significant announcement on October 4th, launching the **European Declaration** on Cycling at the Urban Mobility Days in Seville. This declaration underscores Brussels' strong commitment to promoting cycling as a sustainable mode of transport.

The declaration promises increased funding and political backing for cycling, aiming to boost both its popularity and the EU's bicycle industry. Commissioner Vălean emphasized the potential to enhance cyclist safety and stimulate job growth, particularly in training and cycling tourism. Notably, bicycle production within the EU surged by 29% in 2022, reaching 14.7 million units.

Containing thirty-six key principles, the declaration serves as a foundation for future legislation. These principles encompass improving cycling infrastructure, expanding investments in cycling, nurturing a world-class bicycle manufacturing sector, promoting two-wheel tourism, and enhancing data collection on cycling.



While not legally binding, the declaration elevates cycling to the status of a European concern rather than merely a local or regional issue. It empowers local and national advocates to push for pro-cycling legislation in their respective member states. Furthermore, this development opens doors for cycling in EU laws and encourages governments to uphold their cycling commitments. This leverage is particularly vital in regions where investment in cycling infrastructure lags behind other transportation priorities.

In the short term, advocates hope the declaration will lead to increased investment in cycling, potentially tapping into EU funding instruments such as the Social Climate Fund, the European Regional Development Fund, and the Cohesion Fund. The cycling industry has warmly welcomed this groundbreaking declaration, heralding it as a momentous step toward a greener, healthier, and more sustainable future for European transportation.





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
